## BARNET PRIMARY SCHOOL SPORTS COMPETITION



On Tuesday, we took 51 children to compete in the annual primary athletics competition at Allianz Park. After months of training and a morning spell of rain, we made our way on the coach to Allianz Park with the hope of winning

something at this year's competition. The event got underway at 10am with the Year 5 field events which we done well in placing and picking up points in a range of events.

At 10:30 it was the Year 6's turn to take the stage and we did extremely well with Kai, Giditte, Tobi all winning their events and Krutarth, Leah, Jack and Rhea all finishing in the top 3.

With a strong start to the morning we were doing fantastically, scoring over 40 points and more than likely, somewhere near the top of the leaderboard.

After the lunch, the sprints started in which we won 5, followed by the long distance. Unfortunately we didn't win any of the long distance races but all children placed well picking up points for the team.

The last event was the 4x4 relays for both boys and girls which counted as double points.

First of all our Year 4 boys and girls both won their relays followed by our Year 5 girls winning theirs as well. A strong start to the relays saw us in contention for a strong place at the end of the day. Our Year 5 boys and both Year 6 relays teams all finished third meaning it was a strong end to the day.

At the end of the day, there was a parade for each school to show off the colours of the country they represented.

Finally it was results time. They announced the trophies for tug of war and field events (in which we came second, only one point away from winning) and then moved onto the relay trophies. After announcing two other schools in the girls relay, they finally announced Underhill were the overall winners of the girls relay trophy for 2019 with a total of 20 points!

First trophy claimed of the day and then it was the overall trophy. This trophy accumulated all of the points over the whole of the day and every event combined. They announced Danegrove has finished second on 91 points and then first place was awarded to... Underhill, with 93 points!




It was also noted that Danegrove had won the trophy for the last eight years and now it was our turn to claim it for ourselves!

#### **NURSERY**



In Squirrels Class this week we have enjoyed exploring a new story called 'Aaaarrgghh, Spider!' We have been using lots of art resources to create spider webs such as charcoal, glue and glitter. We have also been creating our own version of spiders using playdough and carefully choosing 8 pipe cleaners and 2 googly eyes

to help us with our counting skills. We have been looking closely at different insects, hiding in the soil in our messy tray, with magnifying glasses. During carpet sessions we have been practising our gross motor movements and physical development through cosmic kids yoga. Can your child show you one of the yoga moves we've learnt?

In Rabbits class this week we have been reading the sequel to 'What the Ladybird heard' which is aptly named 'What the ladybird heard Next'! We have been designing our own maps of the farm yard as well as making our own tiny books telling our own versions of the story. We have used tissue paper to make our own collage ladybirds out of paper plates adding googly eyes, legs and a smile, whilst also writing our names on the back. Our ladybird theme has really helped us to practise our counting too as we have decorated printed ladybird shapes with spots and counted how many spots there are. We even had a try at writing the numbers underneath! We have been learning that there are three rules to help us learn how to count, can the children tell you what they are?
